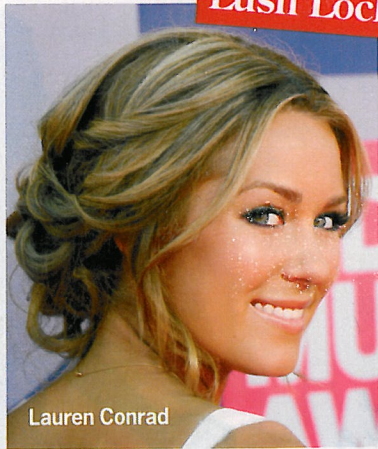
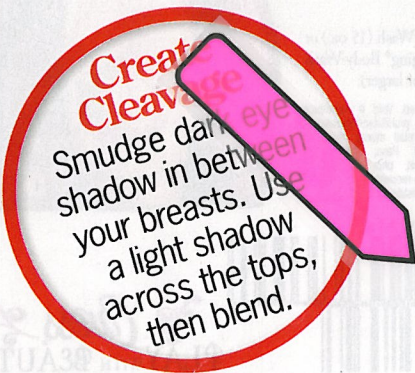

## A Healthy Glow

● **Don't do foundation.** Wait, was that a typo? No, you read right. The makeup pros recommend skipping foundation in the p.m. since it can look cakey. 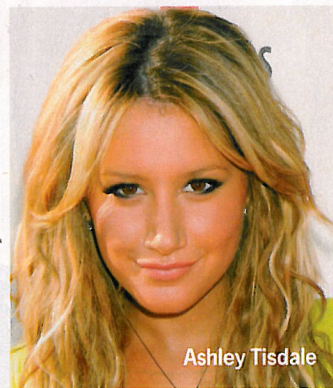

● **Stroke on wild liner.** Rim your lashes with a fun teal pencil, and smoke it out with a cotton swab. You can also dip a brush in waterproof purple or blue mascara and trace around your eyes. FYI: The bolder the liner, the softer your eye shadow should be.

● **Reverse it.** Doing eyeliner halfway is unexpected. Start at the outer corner, and trace in until you reach the spot aligned with the middle of your pupil. Finish with metallic shadow (try Max Factor Vivid Impact Eyeshadow in Two Cents, \$5.49, at Walmart) the rest of the way.
