WEN RE-MOIST HYDRATING MASK

Chaz Dean's hair products are distinguished by their lack of detergents and harsh chemicals, but they took me a while to get used to because they don't lather. But now I'm a believer. The jewel of the line, I believe, is this easy-to-use mask. After you wash your hair, slather on the mask and leave in 45 minutes or longer and then rinse. This is the perfect "soothing" conditioner. It is extremely light yet manages a distinctly cohesive hold. It smells wonderful too, with orange flower extract and orange oil. But the best part? TERAX HYDRATE BOTANICA

If you have normal to dry hair, this will offer all the protection you need in the harsh winter months. After hair is washed, rub in the conditioner from roots to tip and leave in for styling. The best line of hair products you've never heard of. The standouts? The Priming spray preps the hair for structured styling, while the Linear Serum helps keep the hair pin-straight.
